FY25 Budget Work Sessions – Forecast and Recap

As a reminder for Council, as part of the annual budget process the Budget and Management Services department holds Budget Work Sessions with City Council from February through April. During these

sessions staff from various departments, in coordination with the City Manager's Office, present contextual and background information on various topics in advance of the formal proposed budget. Work sessions allow Council to become more familiar with the scope and operations of departments, the needs of the community and serve to facilitate discussion between Council and department staff. Topics of Budget Work Sessions and the corresponding dates for the current budget process are shown below.

February Budget Work Session

- Date: February 19, 2024
- Topics: General Fund Outlook and Compensation and Benefits

March Budget Work Session

- Date: March 11, 2024
- Topics: City of Raleigh Enterprise Funds

April Budget Work Session

- Date: April 8, 2024
- Topics: Grants, Fees, and Capital Improvement Program (CIP)

On May 21, the City Manager will present the FY25 Proposed Budget to the City Council. A public presentation will be made before the City Council, staff, members of the press and interested community members. As required by the Budget and Fiscal Control Act, a copy of the Proposed Budget will be filed with the City Clerk and made available for public inspection. City Council Budget Work Sessions are scheduled for June 3, 10, 17, and 24. These sessions will provide the City Council to review and discuss the Proposed Budget. In accordance with the Budget and Fiscal Control Act, the City Council will hold a public hearing on June 4 for the FY25 Proposed Budget prior to the adoption of the budget ordinance. On or prior to July 1, City Council must adopt the five-year Capital Improvement Program, the final budget ordinance with balanced revenues and expenditures, and set the tax rate for the next fiscal year.

2023-24 Seasonal Loose-Leaf Collection Complete

Seasonal loose-leaf collection for the 2023-2024 season has been completed.

Crews completed the second round of loose-leaf collection on Thursday, March 7; the seasonal leaf collection program began Monday, October 30, 2023.



Loose leaf collection is a residential service for residents living inside Raleigh city limits and features two rounds of vacuuming leaf piles placed between the curb and sidewalk. This season, crews collected 3,059 loads of leaves estimated at over 67,000 cubic yards. This amount would fill the entire Raleigh Municipal Building at a height of over 90 feet.

From March 11 to March 29 residents can complete the <u>Missed Leaf Collection form</u> for any leaf piles that may have been put out late, blocked by vehicles during the collection cycles, or otherwise missed. The form, and other valuable program information, is available on the loose-leaf collection page at <u>raleighnc.gov/leaf</u>.

Raleigh's Amphitheaters Drive \$40 Million in Economic Impact Red Hat Amphitheater and Coastal Credit Union Music Park at Walnut Creek steer a momentous year for the area's thriving live entertainment scene

Raleigh, N.C. – Raleigh continues to be a cultural hub for live entertainment as home to some of the hottest concert venues in the Southeast, including Red Hat Amphitheater and Coastal Credit Union Music Park at Walnut Creek.

Both amphitheaters are part of The Complex, the City of Raleigh's premier portfolio of convention and entertainment venues, which also includes the Raleigh Convention Center and Martin Marietta Center for the Performing Arts. Through these venues, The Complex stimulates an innovative, artistic, and cultural presence in the community and continues to highlight Raleigh as a nationally recognized entertainment destination.

"Raleigh's amped up music venues have a reputation of being a favorite for artists and fans alike," said Kerry Painter, Director/General Manager of The Complex. "Each year, we welcome hundreds of thousands to our amphitheaters and we're proud to be the hot spot where so many unforgettable moments are made."

Through a partnership with Live Nation, both amphitheaters host the top touring artists in the world and bring a combined annual \$40 million in economic impact to Raleigh. In 2023 alone, Red Hat Amphitheater and Coastal Credit Union Music Park at Walnut Creek welcomed over 300,000 fans across a combined 60 concerts. In addition to enjoying live music, these fans also spend on hotels and lodging, food and beverage, transportation and retail right in Raleigh.

"We're so proud to be part of Raleigh's incredible growth story and to play a vital role in the city's dynamic entertainment scene," said Jeannine Beson, regional vice president of venue operations for Live Nation. "Significant investments in both amphitheaters over the last few years allowed us to enhance fan experience by expanding entry gates for fast access, adding state-of-the-art LED screens and offering an elevated food and beverage program. We take pride in making these venues better each season and partnering with the City to make Downtown Raleigh a destination for live music fans."

Located in the heart of Downtown Raleigh, Red Hat Amphitheater offers incredible views of the city skyline with stacked lineups year after year. The amphitheater also offers an elevated fan hospitality experience including a VIP Lounge which was added last season. This year, Red Hat Amphitheater will host Tate McCrae, Lainey Wilson, Queens of the Stone Age, and more to be announced.

Coastal Credit Union Music Park at Walnut Creek has over thirty years of live music history, playing host to major tours and festivals during the summer season and laying a foundation for the local music scene. The 2024 calendar already boasts Foo Fighters, HARDY, Hozier, Alanis Morissette, and more. The venue will also take part in Live Nation's Lawnie Pass program, a popular seasonal pass that allows live music fans to enjoy a lineup of the summer's best concerts across genres like country, rock, pop, hip-hop and more for around \$10 per show.

The Complex is dedicated to promoting sustainable practices within its venues and the community. Coastal Credit Union Music Park is one of the leading venues in Live Nation's Green Nation sustainability program, which has zero waste teams working to reduce single-use plastics and promote recycling, composting and food donations. With a long history of sustainable operations, Coastal Credit Union Music Park also provides artist catering options from their backstage garden and diverted more than 70% of its waste in 2023. Red Hat Amphitheater is also initiating new partnerships with Great Raleigh Clean Up and Compost Now for the 2024 season.

Both venues also provide full time and seasonal employment to residents. The amphitheaters employ more than 600 crew members and are actively hiring for the 2024 season.

Raleigh's mild climate creates a spectacular season for amphitheater concerts, with both venues operating from as early as April through as late as October. Red Hat Amphitheater and Coastal Credit Union Music have consistently been awarded as Best Outdoor Music Venue and Best Live Music Venue from local publications, plus received national recognition from Pollstar and Venues Now.

About The Complex

The Raleigh Convention and Performing Arts Complex ("The Complex") encompasses four city-owned and managed facilities that bring together local residents, out-of-town visitors and a host of performing artists from around the country and the world.

In the heart of North Carolina's vibrant capitol city, three of the four venues welcome some 1 million visitors to downtown Raleigh each year. The award-winning, 500,000-square-foot Raleigh Convention Center is a leader in innovation, sustainability and guest experience. Next door sits the city's signature open-air music venue, Red Hat Amphitheater, with 6,000 seats and a buzzworthy schedule of musical performances.

A short walk away, the Martin Marietta Center for the Performing Arts offers four unique theaters, seating from 150 to 2,369, and is home to resident companies Carolina Ballet, North Carolina Symphony, North Carolina Opera and PineCone. Beyond Downtown Raleigh, Coastal Credit Union Music Park at Walnut Creek boasts a 20,000-person capacity amphitheater on 77 rolling green acres and regularly packs the house with bigname acts.
