Follow up to the September 17 Council Meeting

Stormwater Drainage Issue at 1421 Scales Street (Mayor Baldwin)

During the meeting, Council requested that Stormwater staff investigate a stormwater drainage issue at 1421 Scales Street. The issue involved a stormwater pipe that had been installed on the adjacent property at 1500 Creedmoor Road, which is the location of a church. Staff have found that installation of this pipe is not a violation of any city stormwater-related regulation or ordinance. Therefore, any disputes related to the impacts of or the location of the referenced pipe relative to a property line would be a private civil matter between the property owners. The city would have no role in resolving this matter.
