E-Bike Rebate Program Update

Applications to participate in the E-Bike Rebate Program will run from Monday, October 28 through Sunday, November 10. The E-Bike Rebate Program will offer 150 total vouchers for City residents to either receive or support a purchase towards a new e-bike.

There are two (2) voucher categories, each with 75 available vouchers. The first voucher category is the standard voucher, which will have a redeemable value of \$500. Any permanent Raleigh resident, 18 years or older, will be eligible to apply and participate in the selection process. The second voucher category is the income-adjusted voucher, which will have a redeemable value of \$1,500. The income-adjusted voucher will only be open to applicants who meet the qualifications for the standard voucher and meet the income threshold established by the program. To qualify an applicant must have an annual income at or below 80 percent of the Raleigh area median income (AMI). Voucher recipients will be chosen by a random-selection software, performed by a solicited third-party vendor.

The goal of the E-Bike Rebate Program is to reduce greenhouse emissions caused by single-occupant vehicle usage, expand transportation access to underserved or disadvantaged communities and support healthier forms of transportation. The program also aligns with the Community Climate Action Plan, adopted by the City in 2021. The program is funded in part through the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant

administered by the U.S. Department of Energy. Development of the E-Bike Rebate Program was authorized in February.

Housing & Neighborhoods Update on Dix Camp Clean-up and Resource Pop Event

On October 9 a camp clean-up and resource pop-up event was held for people living unsheltered at the camp on the Dix Park property across from Healing Transitions. The clean-up effort was successful due to the collaborative efforts of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Resources (PRCR) and Healing Transitions. Healing Transitions recruited a group of 52 volunteers to assist with the clean-up, and PRCR's Refuse unit, with the help of Dix and Pullen Parks staff, removed 11,000 pounds of trash and debris from the site – almost double the amount removed during the spring clean-up.



The resource pop-up was held in the Healing Transitions parking lot. Eight service providers attended, including Healing Transitions (resources referrals), ACORNS (resources referrals), InterFaith Food Shuttle (bags of groceries), Oak City Cares (resources referrals), Triangle Family Services (street outreach, nurse services and shoes), WakeMed (severe and persistent mental illness resources), Veteran Affairs (resources for veterans), and Families Together (resources for families). Oak City Cares, in coordination with Housing and Neighborhoods, was also able to connect one highly medically vulnerable household directly to housing and support services and is working to connect a second household to housing and support services.

Commerce Place Phase 1 Grand Opening

The grand opening for Phase 1 of the Commerce Place project is scheduled for Friday, November 1 from 3:00 - 8:00 pm as part of the monthly First Friday events. Improvements completed as part of this phase have just been installed and include new pedestrian safety improvements, outdoor seating, some of the first overhead string lighting in downtown, and two 2,000 sq ft, on-street murals designed by a local artist. The opening event will be hosted on Commerce Place between Martin and Davie St, and will feature live music, games, snacks, local business pop-ups, and community engagement to source creative ideas for future programming.



This project was made possible through a collaboration led by the Urban Projects Group staff in partnership with the Raleigh Transportation Department, Raleigh Arts, Turnbridge Equities, Empire Properties, Downtown Raleigh Alliance, and the Raleigh Design Review Commission.
