LGBTQIA+ Historic Context Study Update

The LGBTQIA+ Historic Context Study report is complete. Phase II of the <u>LGBTQIA+ Historic Context Study</u> kicked off in late July 2024. Throughout the remainder of the year, the project consultant researched and drafted the report while City staff conducted a series of online surveys seeking public input. The <u>final report</u>, <u>project summary</u>, and responses to survey feedback are now available on the project page.

The report includes:

- Historic context statement of Raleigh's LGBTQIA+ communities by decade.
- Suggestions for new non-regulatory programs to celebrate culturally important places.
- Recommendations for potential next steps and future research.
- 20 individual site evaluations.
- A simplified list of all LGBTQIA+ associated places identified during the project.

A final community meeting is scheduled for Monday, March 24th at the Pullen Community Center (408 Ashe Avenue) at 7:00 p.m. The project team will share project findings and discuss potential next steps for

utilization of the project research. An interactive digital mapping tool of the full list of identified places is already in development and will be made available on the Raleigh Open Data portal. Staff anticipates that presentation of the final report to the Raleigh Historic Development Commission will take place in early April and subsequently to the City Council.

Follow up to the February 18 Work Session

Streambank Erosion Study Status and Update (Council Member Harrison)

During the work session, Council requested that staff provide periodic updates on the status of the Streambank Erosion Study being conducted by United States Geological Survey (USGS), with support funding provided by the City. The request was a follow up to the staff presentation related to streambank protection initiatives during the October 22, 2024, meeting of the Council's Growth and Natural Resources Committee.

An overview of the study and data releases are available on the <u>USGS website</u>; a separate <u>Project Story Map titled "Finding Erosion Hotspots in Raleigh, NC</u> has been developed with the latest findings. Study results must go through an extensive USGS peer review process prior to the final report being released, anticipated to occur later this year. Staff are currently preparing more detailed information as to how this study will be used to guide the city's overall stream protection programs, along with additional stream protection recommendations.
