The GoRaleigh transit system will be providing an Express Bus Service to the 2025 North Carolina State Fair throughout the duration of the run, beginning October 16 and concluding October 26, 2025. Round-trip fare is \$5 (one-way is \$4). Seniors 65 and older and passengers with disabilities are eligible to receive a half-fare

rate at \$2.50. Children under 40" tall ride for free. The pickup and drop-off location will be located at 1525 Garner Station Boulevard in Raleigh (behind the Goodberry's, near Garner). Staff was unable to secure an agreement with Triangle Town Center and therefore will not be serving that location during this year's fair run. GoPasses and Transit Assistance Passes are not eligible for this service.

Council Member Follow Up Items

Follow up from the September 16 Council Meeting

Qualified Census Tract Information - Council Member Patton

During the meeting, Council requested information on Qualified Census Tracts (QCTs) including the frequency of designation and how frequently designations are updated.

A QCT is a federally designated census tract designed to provide preferential tax treatment for affordable housing investments through the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC) program. QCTs are a vehicle to target LIHTC resources to neighborhoods with high need for affordable housing based on the income and poverty status of current residents. The designations are determined using consistent federal data, statutory thresholds for poverty and income, and an annual review process led by U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Designation Criteria

HUD designates QCTs based on two primary criteria: 1) a census tract qualifies if at least 50% of its households have incomes below 60% of the Area Median Gross Income (AMGI); or 2) if the tract has a poverty rate of at least 25%. To avoid overconcentration of designations, federal law also imposes a population cap such that no more than 20% of the population within a metropolitan statistical area (city) or non-metro county can reside in QCTs. If more than 20% of the population qualifies, HUD prioritizes tracts with either the highest poverty levels or the lowest income levels until the cap is met.

Data Sources

HUD relies on multiple datasets to ensure reliable designations:

- American Community Survey (ACS) 5-Year Estimates: Household income levels and poverty rates.
- Area Median Gross Income (AMGI): Derived from HUD's income limits and matched with ACS data.
- Population counts: From the U.S. Census Bureau, to enforce the 20% population cap.

Update Process

HUD updates QCT designations annually, as required by statute, and publishes the lists in the Federal Register. New and revised designations become effective January 1 of the following year (e.g., tracts

identified in the fall of 2024 take effect January 1, 2025). This annual process ensures that QCT designations remain aligned with current demographic and economic conditions.

Impacts of QCTs on Affordable Housing Development

When utilizing LIHTC to develop affordable housing the price of land is a significant factor. Land costs are not included in the eligible basis, meaning the cost of the land does not factor into the amount of tax credits potentially awarded to the project. Developments located in QCTs are eligible for a basis boost, resulting in higher tax credit allocations and financing equity.

On Tuesday, September 30, HUD published a notice in the federal register designating the <u>2026 QCTs</u>. Wake County will have 30 Qualified Census Tracts in 2026, with approximately 26 tracts located within the City of Raleigh. As census tracts do not align with municipal boundaries, it is to be expected that tracts overlap jurisdictions and unincorporated areas outside the boundaries of a municipal jurisdiction.
