STAFF REPORT

Based on the information contained in the application and staff's evaluation:

- A. The installatation of 7"x11" bronze plaques on National Register-contributing structures as part of a neighborhood program is not incongruous in concept according to *Guidelines* 1.8.2, 1.8.4, 1.8.5, 1.8.6, 1.8.7, 1.8.8, and the following suggested facts:
- 1* The plaques are compatible in size, material, color, scale and character with Raleigh historic districts; they are integral to the facades of historic buildings.
- 2* Bronze is a traditional plaque material and compatible with the historic districts.
- 3* The plaques will be installed so that no architectural details or features are obscured or damaged. On masonry buildings, the plaques will be installed by fasteners in mortar joints.
- 4* The properties selected for plaque installations will be National Register-contributing structures. The installation of the plaque is voluntary by the property owner.

Staff suggests that the committee approve the programmatic application for the establishment of a plaque program.

2	Changes to Building Exterior	Cast bronze plaque 11" x 7" x 3/8" thick, oriented horizontally. Each plaque will be identical except for the engraved portion which will bear the name of the house as listed on the National Register, and the date of the structure. Plaques will generally be installed on the left or the right side of the front door depending on the architectural features of the house, approximately 4' above the porch or entry floor. Only houses identified as contributing structures to the Glenwood-Brooklyn National Register Historic District will have the opportunity to buy and install a plaque. A group of neighbors will purchase and install plaques as a part of the initial order, and others will be able to order matching plaques in the future at their discretion.




Written Description

The Glenwood-Brooklyn Neighborhood Association wishes to offer the opportunity to residents to purchase cast bronze plaques to identify the historic homes within the neighborhood. A group of neighbors worked together to produce the plaque design presented in this application package, which is based on the plaques currently installed throughout the Oakwood Historic District. In fact, the plaques proposed will be produced by the same company who makes the plaques for Oakwood. The plaques will be 7" high x 11" wide x 3/8" thick, oriented horizontally, with raised lettering and the neighborhood tree logo, and and a raised border around the perimeter. Each plaque will also have a raised field where the name and date of each historic house will be engraved. The names and dates will match the information for the historic resources on the National Register nomination. The plaques will be installed either to the left or the right side of the front door at approximately 4'-0" above the finished poorch floor, depending on what works best with the architectural details of the structure. Only homes listed as contributing structures to the historic district will have the opportunity to display the bronze plaques, and there will be no requirement for owners of historic homes to purchase the plaques.



Glenwood-Brooklyn Historic District






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Oakwood Homes Displaying Plaque - Denotes proposed plaque location and size relative to historic homes
