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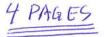

1) Complete removal of 1 large, declining elm tree located in the right rear yard just inside fence line. This leaning tree has a co-dominant top and the right side, which is ~ 50% of the entire canopy, is completely dead. There are also outwardly visible signs of Ambrosia beetles around the base of the tree. This entire tree is dying and is currently a hazard and should be removed. We will utilize and set-up our self-propelled man lift in multiple locations to safely piece this tree down in small sections. The stump will be cut as low to the ground as possible and all material will be neatly removed from the property.		1,500.00	1,500.00
2) Complete removal of 1 tall, declining elm tree located just outside of the left rear fence line. The canopy of this tree is currently 30% dead and the lower stem has decay holes present. As the canopy of this tree continues to die, and the decay in the base progresses, it will become an increased hazard. I recommend removing it now rather than waiting for sections to fall out. I am reviewing the COA application for tree removals at 1021 W South Street and need additional information before I can complete the review.

- Please provide photographs of the trees proposed for removal.
- For the application to be reviewed as a Minor Work, the removals must be accompanied by replacement trees. If evidence is Provided that there is no appropriate location for new trees to be placed on the property, the replacement may be substituted by a donation to the NeighborWoods tree planting program (approximately \$50 per tree). The donation form is attached should you choose that route. I will forward the donation to the program with the notation that the trees are specifically for the Boylan Heights historic district.
- Should replacement trees not be proposed, the item is classified as a Major Work to be decision by the COA
 Committee and the following additional information provided:
