The following program is recommended for certain trees and shrubs on your property. In addition to a thorough plant health care program, Bartlett Tree Experts recommends having a qualified arborist inspect your property periodically to assist you in identifying potential risks or hazardous conditions relating to your trees or shrubs. THIS IS NOT AN INVOICE.

It is my recommendation, based on the condition of the tree and the impact of failure, that the Water Oak in question be removed.

To support this recommendation, let me 1st define a few terms Arborist use in hazard tree assessment.

RISK- the combination of the likelihood of an event and the severity of the potential consequences. In the context of trees, risk is the likelihood of a conflict or tree failure occurring and affecting a target and the severity of the associated consequences- personal injury, property damage, or disruption of activities.

TARGETS (risk targets) - are people, property, or activities that could be injured, damaged, or disrupted by a tree.

FAILURE (tree failure) - is the breakage of stem, branches, roots, or loss of mechanical support in the root system.

Due to the cavity at the base of the tree, the structure of the tree is compromised. I also observed mistletoe throughout the crown of the tree. This indicates the presence of a pathogen within the tree. Given these two problems, the potential for failure and risk to surrounding targets is higher than if the tree were perfectly healthy. To minimize risk of failure, a cabling support system could be installed. To eliminate the risk in its entirety, the tree would have to be removed.

Given the pedestrian traffic and the close proximity to the parking area, impact of failure has the potential to be catastrophic. In my professional opinion, due to the large cavity and the presence of a pathogen, the tree is not worth the risk and should be removed.

If removed, I do not see the necessity to replace it given the amount of trees close by. If the decision to replace the tree is made, I recommend a smaller ornamental tree such as a Dogwood or flowering Cherry. Some type of tree that will fit the location well and not grow into another large specimen tree.

It should be noted that I am a certified arborist through the International Society of Arboriculture

Install 3 supplemental support cables in Water Oak located at the front center along walkway to limit branch movement to reduce the risk of branch failure.

Supports require periodic inspection for evidence of fatigue and to verify functionality. Please contact your Bartlett Arborist to schedule the inspection each year.

Amount: \$990.00 Remove the tagged Water Oak located at the front center along walkway. Leave stump as close to grade as possible. Remove resulting debris.

Amount: \$4,275.00

Grind the Water Oak stump located at the front center along walkway to approximately 8 inches below existing grade. Remove all mulch from site.

Amount: \$391.00
