There is a tree at the back of the property at 807 McCulloch St that has been reported as being a possible hazard. After a visual assessment of the tree in question, as a Certified Arborist, here are my findings.

The tree, a Black Walnut, is in heavy decline and is a hazard to the existing structure on site and adjacent pedestrian walkways. I recommend removal of this tree to mitigate any hazards. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns.
