

Caitlin,

Thanks for the additional photographs. Painting the front door is considered congruous and approvable by staff. With the additional photo evidence that the brick foundation of the porch is already painted, that request can be approved as a minor work with staff as well. We will look for the physical paint swatches before we can provide approval and mail the blue placard. The paint schedule appears to be appropriate, presuming that the color brightness of the physical swatches are consistent with the digital swatches.

I am unaware of changes to the COA application form itself since I began work for the city in January 2020. However, we do still require stamped and addressed envelopes for providing public notice to all property owners within 100 feet of the application property. Caitlin,

Thank you for submitting a minor work application for repainting the house at 309 S Boylan Ave. We are close to completing the review and need a couple of clarifications. First, will you please provide a close-up photo of the front door? It is hard to tell by the photos provided whether the existing front door is painted or stained. Please also provide an overall photo of the front house elevation showing the painted front porch brick foundation. From the side elevation photo, it appears that it may not be.

If the porch foundation is not already painted, we are not able to approve the painting of unpainted brick at the staff level. You have a couple of options open to you. You can convert the full minor work to a major work to be reviewed by the RHDC's COA Committee. Alternatively, you are able to remove the painted brick request from the minor work so that the other requests may proceed and submit a new major work COA just for the foundation painting. We currently have a 2-month back log of cases due to the cancellation of the March and April meetings as a result of COVID-19. We are evaluating how we can catch-up on the case load, but it is likely to impact summer project schedules.

Please let us know how you would like to proceed. We look forward to receiving the additional materials whenever you are ready. Thank you.
