



We previously submitted a COA and was approved, we are only resubmitting because upon putting larger samples of our color choices on the house, we felt a more muted purple would fit the neighborhood better. The new colors are similar but not as bright.

The color soulmate will go on the siding on the first story and the top gable shakes. The color autumn orchid will go on the shakes on the second story of the house only. Intricate ivory is the trim color and will go on all door, window and house trim including the porch ceiling and railing as detailed by the previous COA trim selection. Dovetail is the foundation color that will cover all brick foundation. Hunt Club is a green that was previously approved but I will include again, this color will appear only in the window sashes as an accent color on the house. All paint colors are sherwin Williams.




SW9157 - Autumn. orchid



SW6350 - intricate ivory


