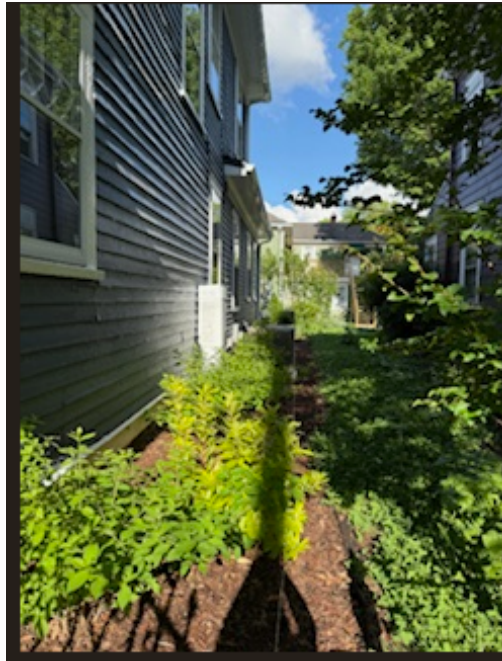

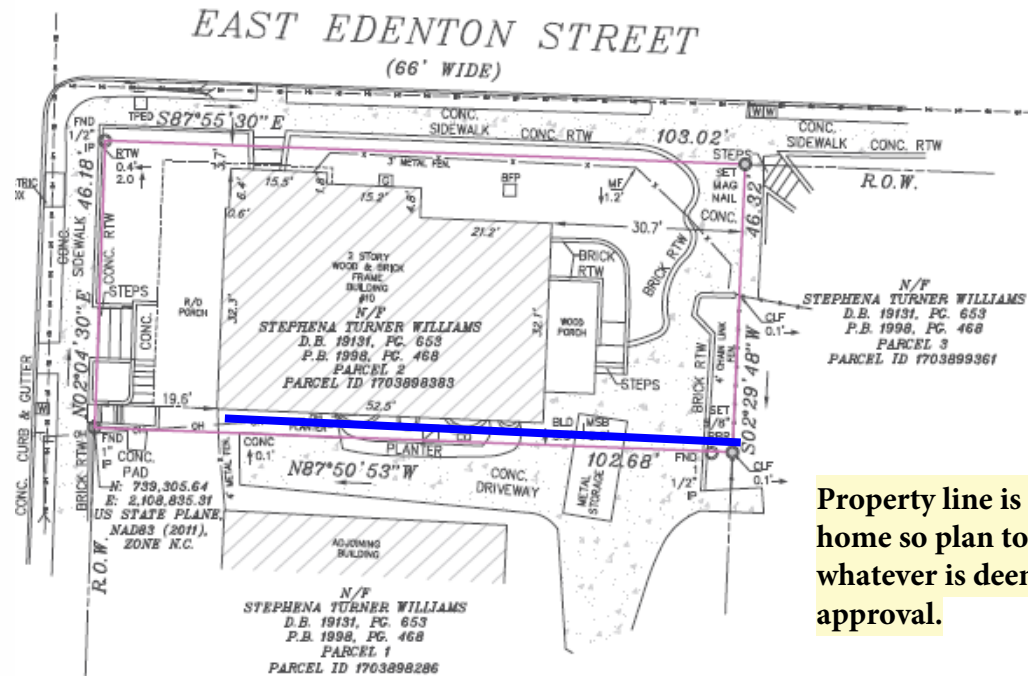

Property line is 42" from side of home so plan to put fence at 39" or whatever is deemed appropriate for approval. Wooden cedar fence would run from back of property and end prior to front porch to meet up with black wrought iron fence as noted with blue line in survey in other attachment. About 3/4 of the gate of the wrought iron fence is located on our property so we'll minimize the width of the gate and then add more wrought iron spindles to the wrought iron fence to meet up with the new location of the gate (we have additional fence pieces available for use).



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
