Community Reunion Mural - Certificate of Appropriateness Application Written Description



Summary:

A collaboration between Activate Good and the Raleigh Murals Project, the "Community Reunion Mural Project" will bring together community members as volunteers to paint a mural in Downtown Raleigh. The project will be designed and refined by professional artists who will provide guidance and touch-ups throughout the community engagement.

Project Purpose:

The project's goal is to use **volunteer service** and **art** as a means of *building community*, raising resident morale as the community recovers from the effects of COVID-19, and *bringing people together across differences* by engaging them in a fun project, the results of which they can enjoy and feel a sense of ownership over for years to come.

About Activate Good:

Founded 2005, Activate Good is a nonprofit that mobilizes people around Raleigh and the Triangle to improve their community through people-powered projects for good. We believe we all have a responsibility to work towards a better world. We work with over 500 area nonprofits and community partners to provide opportunities for everyday people to get involved in service and community engagement. Artists:

Professional local artists Okirah Harris and Grayson Howell (OG Designs & Creations) have created the mural design and will work with Activate Good to oversee and guide community member participation and final touch-ups. Schedule:

Activate Good aims to align the volunteer engagement portion of the mural project with our September 2021 Month of Service, when we also hope the weather will be perfect for an outdoor, socially distanced volunteer project. Intended Volunteer Painting Days include September 10 and 11 (rain dates: September 17 and 18). A "community and media reveal" will occur as soon as the mural is completed and touched up by participating professional artists.

Mural Location:

The proposed work includes painting a multi-color mural on the bottom half of the wall of 19 E. Martin Street (on the side of the building facing S. Wilmington Street). There would be no proposed change to the underlying paint already on the building. The wall will be cleaned using appropriate methods (per RDHC <u>design</u> <u>quidelines</u>) to prepare for the mural paint.

Dimensions: The estimated length of the mural is approximately 54-57 feet, running from the edge of the building corner (towards Market Plaza). We estimate the height of the mural, at its tallest point, to be no higher than 15 feet tall.



Materials:

This outdoor mural will be painted using water and weatherproof paints such as acrylic latex paints suitable for outdoor use. Paint colors will match those in the attached design mock-up. Artists and participating community members will utilize ladders, paint brushes, paint rollers, paint cups and pans, floor coverings, and personal protective gear (like aprons or shoe coverings) to execute the painting of the mural.

*Note: The black rectangle represents a door. The building owner (Chris Muotos) has just confirmed we would be able to paint that door.


