

We would like to remove the pine tree located on the North side of our property adjacent to Jones Street. The tree is located approximately 1 foot away from the retaining wall that borders our property. The root system has created significant damage to the retaining wall and compromised it's integrity and safety. As can be seen in the pictures, there is significant cracking along the wall. The root system has also pushed the retaining wall outwards creating an overall lean towards the sidewalk of the entire length of the wall. We will replace the tree being removed with a similar tree in a comparable location.

Kirsten,

Since the tree appears to be damaging the historic wall, staff should be able to approve its removal as long as a replacement tree will be planted on your property (or in the right-of-way if approved by Urban Forestry staff.) You should specify on your COA application that it will be replaced by a tree in the public right-of-way that is the largest appropriate tree approvable by the Urban Forestry staff. Please include all the information and photos you've provided in this email with your COA application.

You will find the COA application on the <u>City's website</u>. You will need to complete and sign the application, then submit it through the Permit and Development Portal which can be accessed on the same web page. You can anticipate an approximately two-week review period after we receive your application. The <u>Urban Forestry web page</u> includes an online form to request planting a new tree in the right-of-way.

Hello,

Thank you for your response.

- 123 N Bloodworth St. (corner of Jones and Bloodowrth)
- We did have an arborist come to look at the tree and discuss removal.
- The tree is healthy however it is located approximately 1 foot from the retaining wall and is diminishing the integrity and safety of the wall.
- The tree is located in the side yard on Jones St.
- We would propose to put the replacement tree on the right of way between the sidewalk and Jones St. as to prevent any future damage to the retaining wall.

I have attached a picture of the wall immediately below the tree where the damage can be clearly seen. The second picture is looking along the retaining wall. It is difficult to see in the picture but the root system is causing the entire wall to lean out heavily towards the sidewalk.<ia>sidewalk.<image001.jpg><ia>simage002.jpg>
