



There are six American Lindens (Tilia Americana), on the subject property. One, located at the property's southwest corner had a major section of the trunk bark slough off exposing a substantially deteriorated (rotten) inner trunk. Due to competition from adjacent trees, the Linden leans west into the North Blount Street R.O.W. and over utility lines.

We are proposing to remove the tree. A replacement tree (single-trunk Crepe Myrtle) will be installed by the City of Raleigh in the utility strip of North Blount Street in close proximity of the Linden to be removed (ref:Anthony McLamb, City or Raleigh Arborist). This strategy was preferred to installing a new tree in the same location as the existing tree due to the density of other existing shade trees and the associated competition.






OVERALL LOT PLAN 634 N. BLOUNT STREET Raleigh, North Carolina Date: 10-23-2020
