About:

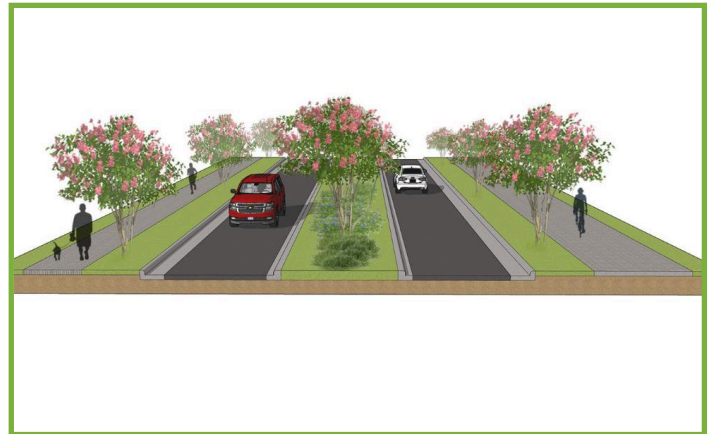
The Project is at the 65 percent design phase. Some of the improvements include:

- Center turn lanes;
- Curb and gutter;
- A median in some locations;
- Improved bus stops;
- Traffic signal upgrades;
- Streetlight upgrades;
- Sidewalks on one side of the roadway and a multi-use path on the other; and,
- Enhancements to the existing street crossing at the House Creek Greenway.

What is New:

Based on public feedback we made design changes.

- We replaced the bike lanes with a 10-foot multi-use path on the west side from Duraleigh Rd. to Glen Eden Dr. and the east side from Glen Eden Dr. to Crabtree Valley Ave.
- We added a pedestrian culvert underneath the road to connect the Greenway.
- A roundabout was selected on the Homewood Banks Dr. intersection.
- We opted for a public 6-foot sidewalk at the back of curb between Tall Oak Trail and Noremac Dr. and will retain the trex-board walkway.



Typical Section:

The typical sections include curb and gutter, a 6-foot sidewalk, a 10-foot multi-use path, 11-foot travel lanes, the addition of street trees, and either a two-way left turn lane or a raised median. The center left-turn lane section will begin at Bentley Bridge Road and continue east to the Arbor Drive/Noremac Drive intersection. The raised median section is between the Arbor Drive/Noremac Drive intersection and east of Vilana Ridge Drive over House Creek. The median width varies between 11 and 15 feet.
