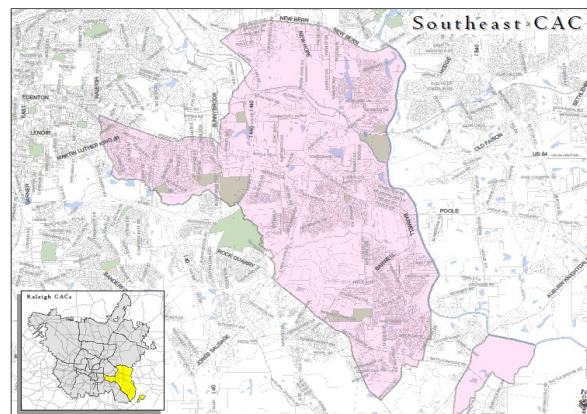

Southeast CAC Meeting Minutes: July 11, 2019

Southeast CAC met on Thursday, July 11, 2019 at 7:00 pm at Barwell Road Community Center with Co-Chair Ulysses Lane presiding. Following a welcome and introduction of officers, he reviewed the agenda for the evening.

Raleigh Parks, Recreation & Cultural Resources Report – Kevin Sanders, Barwell Road Center Asst. Director, stated the active programs at the Center includes gymnastics for youth, dance, Zumba & line dancing (adults), fitness and cardio (adults at \$5). Girls softball registration starts 7/12 and Youth touch football and Cheerleading registrations start on 7/15.

Law Enforcement report was given Officer J.H. Crews who shared: (1) Please do not leave your car unattended or unlocked (2) Be mindful of what you leave exposed in your car (3) Residential burglaries went down during the 20-day cycle. (4) National Night Out will be August 6th. Contact Officer Crews for more information.

City of Raleigh Housing and Neighborhood report was given by Pedro Rodriguez. He shared the purpose of what the department does for the community. Questions were asked from the audience and Mr. Rodriguez answered. Rezoning request for Olde Towne Project was a lengthy discussion on the following issues (1) height of the buildings (2) future land use (3) residential conditions consisting of family income, sewer, water, traffic, bus stops, road conditions, street improvements and flood plains.

The owner of the residential portion of Olde Towne requested to proceed with a new rezoning request and/or text change process to amend the zoning conditions on Olde Towne residential.

The meeting attendees voted. The vote casts were (17) For, (4) Against and (1) Abstain.

There were conditions from the residents which are the following to be addressed: (1) shopping center with a grocery store (2) 300K square footage office space (3) Landscaping (4) sit down restaurants (5) banks (6) gas stations

The vote on the conditions were (13) YES, (2) NO and (zero votes) Abstain
