


MWBE Program Annual Report FY2021-2022

The City of Raleigh is the second fastest growing large metropolis in the United States and continues to receive national recognition for its high quality of life, work, play, and business ownership opportunities. In planning for equitable economic growth, inclusion, and development, the City of Raleigh's Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprise (MWBE) Program strives to connect underrepresented businesses with opportunities, resources, and technical assistance.

Coming up on its 30th Anniversary, the program is now a part of the Department of Equity and Inclusion (DEI). Being part of a department that focuses on leveling the playing field was an essential shift to elevate its programming and visibility. The DEI's focus is to embed equity within our organization and the communities we serve and aligns perfectly with the mission of the MWBE Program.

The program strives for minority and women-owned businesses to perform at least 15% of all City-sponsored construction and repair contracting opportunities of \$300,000 and above. The City's MWBE program supports continuing education, certification, and outreach. In 2022, the City of Raleigh kicked off its first disparity study to identify a baseline in terms of underrepresented groups related to MWBE participation for construction projects, professional services, and other services. During FY21-22, six months of the study phase was completed. Recommendations from the study will provide the necessary next steps to move the needle forward in creating a more equitable and inclusive Raleigh for all!

This report describes the City of Raleigh's efforts to ensure minority and womenowned businesses have greater access to public contracting opportunities, and summarizes program activity, prime contract, and subcontract utilization data for certified Minority and Women-Owned Businesses.

Monthly MWBE Work Group Meetings

This internal work group consists of staff across various City of Raleigh departments. The work group focuses on collecting data in a standardized manner, simplifying current processes, and implementing new processes.



Construction Bid Meetings

MWBE Program staff maintains positive working relationships with all City departments and work collectively to promote the program at pre-bid, bid opening, and pre-construction meetings. In compliance with COVID-19 restrictions the majority of FY 21-22 meetings were attended virtually, however when permitted MWBE staff attended sessions in person.

Through regularly scheduled trainings, MWBE Program staff and City project managers work diligently to ensure best practices in MWBE processes and reporting procedures.

Outreach & Community Engagement

During the year, the MWBE Program staff actively engaged the MWBE business community through outreach events, educational workshops, statewide and local conferences, referrals, and one-on-one counseling sessions.

PROSPERA Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) Seminar

The November 2021 event provided information on disaster loans available for economic damages due to COVID-19. MWBE staff provided information on the City of Raleigh's MWBE Program, how to do business with the City of Raleigh, and the benefits of becoming NCHUB and NCDOT Certified. In efforts to ensure inclusivity, the information was also provided in Spanish.

NC Association of Governmental Purchasing (NCAGP) Conference

MWBE Program staff attended the 66th Annual NCAGP Conference in March 2022. NCAGP supports public procurement professionals in North Carolina through a variety of educational and networking programs and opportunities.

During this event, City of Raleigh MWBE staff led a session and presented information on Supplier Diversity & Inclusion.

Neighborhood Enrichment Presentations

In April 2022, the City of Raleigh hosted a Virtual Neighborhood Enrichment Event.

MWBE staff presented at 2 sessions, educating Raleigh communities about the MWBE Program, its benefits, and supportive resources for underutilized and disadvantaged business enterprises.

The Women's Business Center of North Carolina

With a mission to promote economic self-sufficiency for all women in North Carolina through entrepreneurship, the Women's Business Center of North Carolina hosted the 2022 Moving Forward With Purpose & Taking Hold of the Future Conference.

The event featured an exhibitor hall, which showcased several women and minority-owned businesses and offered educational sessions, networking opportunities, NC State business resources, and business acceleration tools. MWBE Program staff engaged over 20 business representatives, and provided program information and materials to several other booth visitors.



Raleigh's Hispanic & Immigrants Affairs Board

The free and public event was hosted by the Hispanic and Immigrant Affairs Board and took place in June 2022. Panel presentations were presented in both English and Spanish and offered Interpreting services as well.

During this event, MWBE staff had the great pleasure of presenting MWBE Program information and materials, as well as community resources available to assist with business start-up.

Education



HUB/DBE Certification Information Sessions

In collaboration with the NC Department of Administration and the NC Department of Transportation, MWBE Program staff facilitated free public monthly information sessions to educate businesses on NC Department of Transportation Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) and NC Office of Historically Underutilized Businesses (HUB) Certifications.

Our partners presented the benefits and processes of their respective certification programs, while the MWBE team concentrated on the City of Raleigh's MWBE program elements and how to become registered suppliers with the City. Additionally, information was shared on how all partners work collaboratively to advocate for certification and minority business success.






5 Certified MWBE Subcontractors performed on this project representing **\$797,010** in subcontract amounts.






Raleigh Water: Upper Walnut Creek Inceptor

Construction & Repair Projects \$300k and Above

DATA COLLECTION

The MWBE team tracks utilization and operational data, which helps improve outreach efforts, assess program effectiveness, and helps identify opportunities for improvement. Ultimately, data collection informs best practices, which allows the team to become more strategic in its future planning efforts, more intentional in connecting businesses to opportunities, and helps to identify and bridge gaps in utilization.

Table 1 illustrates some of the operational data that the MWBE team has collected over the past 3 years. It is important to note that this data only highlights construction contracting of \$300,000 or above. Table 2 illustrates categorized MWBE participation as defined by the NC Department of Administration's Historically Underutilized Businesses Office. The data breakdown displays the differences in MWBE prime contracting and subcontracting.

Considering projects of \$300,000 or more, 107 projects were monitored and reviewed, averaging \$178,247,967 over the past three years. Total spent with MWBE firms, for this period, averaged \$28,325,922.

Over the past year, COVID-19's residual impacts proved to be challenging for the Construction and Repair industry and continue to remain evident and prevalent. Despite material supply chain disruptions, labor shortages and project delays, the MWBE team continued outreach efforts focused on educational trainings and certification information sessions.








MWBE Participation by Category
