

SOFT SITE ANALYSIS

The map below is often described as a "soft" sites analysis and used to identify vacant or unimproved areas. Clearly, only a small amount of property falls into that category within the Wakefield Small Area Study.


Between the anticipated NCDOT right-ofway acquisition noted and the required 40% reforestation, development of those outparcels at Falls of Neuse Road and the future Capital Boulevard interchange are limited.





Note: Some areas noted as "Existing Development" areas may be vacant currently; however, these sites have pending or approved development plans.



WAKEFIELD TRADE AREAS MAP





MARKET CONDITIONS & DEMAND DRIVERS

- Population will become younger and more diverse overall and will contain more families by 2025


EXECUTIVE SUMMARY KEY FINDING











4 WATER RESOURCE MANAGEMENT



- Stream and buffer preservation should be prioritized on Cityowned land and easements which are found along Richland Creek
- Stream assessments should be conducted on all streams where greenways are to be installed or have already been constructed
- Riparian plantings, bank stabilization and/or stream restoration practices can improve water quality

Note: Due to the extent of overhead and underground utilities in the area, these practices may be limited in scope.













Development within the past 20-30 years has included the installation of **stormwater control measures** such as wet and dry ponds; the opportunity exists to **improve water quality** by utilizing stormwater best practices. Examples for consideration include:

- Retrofitting existing facilities as constructed wetlands
- Reducing impervious cover with reduction of parking spaces and/or replacing them with permeable pavement
- Moving stormwater treatment underground using vault sand filters
- Utilizing soil cells to enhance urban tree canopy and stormwater treatment
- Installing bioswales and vegetated filter strips to encourage infiltration
- Consider downstream restoration as a trade-off instead of pursuing site-level stormwater control measures




WE HEARD

...that over 80% of initial survey respondents wanted the design team to investigate the potential to create a walkable village center in the Wakefield Community. Open House participants helped identify a few possible locations to investigate.
















WE INVESTIGATED

...a potential evolution of the Wakefield Commons shopping center. Suburban retrofits typically include the transformation of auto-centric centers into walkable villages. Design features often include a pedestrian-scale block structure, gathering places for people, and a mixture of uses to encourage vibrancy.















WE HEARD

WE INVESTIGATED

WE FOUND



...that over 80% of initial survey respondents wanted the design team to investigate the potential to create a walkable village center in the Wakefield Community. Open House participants helped identify a few possible locations to investigate.



...a few levels of intervention on the Wakefield Commons site. One that maintains the existing density but adds a few buildings over existing parking to create a community space, and another that increases density and a new walkable block network. The more intense intervention still encourages public space creation along with mixed use buildings that provide housing.



...a transformation of this nature, particularly on a recently developed site, is challenging to achieve based on current site requirements. Additional conversations would be needed to find an approach that balances the urban tree canopy with the transformation of auto-centric areas into walkable village centers.



LAND USE AND ZONING AMENDMENTS

+ Significant redevelopment is not anticipated or permissible in the Wakefield area due to existing regulations and newness of development.



TRANSPORTATION PLAN UPDATES

- + Inclusion in BikeRaleigh Plan and Pedestrian Plan
- + Amendments to Planned Bicycle Facilities



PARKS/RECREATION AND OPEN SPACE PLAN UPDATES

- + Inclusion in Greenways Master Plan
- + Amendments to Parks and Greenway System Map Plus Greenway Corridors and Connectors



FUTURE CAPITAL PROJECTS

+ A series of bicycle and pedestrian improvements along existing and proposed facilities are imagined



URBAN DESIGN GUIDELINES AND FURTHER STUDY

- + No redevelopment is anticipated at this time
- + Should community sentiment change in the future, additional, specific guidelines would be needed to create an appropriate suburban retrofit
