Meeting Notes

Community Connector and Community Leader Group Orientation

Date and time: 9/27/23, 5:30-7pm Location: John Chavis Park

On September 27th 2023 staff from City of Raleigh's Department of Planning and Development hosted an initial orientation for the Community Leaders and Community Connectors Program. This program is was in support of the Wake Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) initiative, particularly the Western BRT and Southern BRT projects.
