Buy only Artist grade paints. Student grade paints have more fillers and do not perform as well. It is a better value to buy Artist grade paints and get better results.

Brushes: Jerry's Artarama has a line of very inexpensive synthetics **Creative Mark Mimik** that do paint well. #1 (or #2) round, #4 round, #8 round, #10 round

Paper: Arches 140 Cold Pressed 22 x 30 inch sheet, 2 sheets to begin class, Paper sold in blocks are also fine, though more expensive, and they don't require a support board. Do not buy cheap paper like Strathmore it does not paint well. Fabriano can be substituted if Arches is not in stock.

Plastic Palette, with cover and multiple wells for paints, center mixing area

Support board: Masonite, foam core, Gatorboard or rigid plexiglass. Minimum size of 11 x 14. (not needed with paper blocks)

Spritz bottle: plastic bottle that sprays fine mist of water. Also found at drug stores in beauty aids department or a Dollar Store, can use a well rinsed windex bottle

Box of tissues, paper towels, masking tape (not blue color)

kneaded eraser, HB or 2B pencil, ruler from home, 2 or 3 plastic cups or containers that hold at least 2 cups water each, pen for notes.

Painting – Designing the Successful Landscape Painting in Oil or Acrylic – Part 1

Instructor: Nancy Carty.

September 5-October 10 T 1:00pm-4:00pm

Students will supply the painting materials for this class.

There will be a lab fee of \$15 dollars per student that they can pay in cash to cover the cost of color and black and white copies of reference photos for the duration of the class. This fee can be paid directly to the instructor on the first day of class by check or in cash. This applies to students who wish to use the reference photos provided by the instructor.

Supplies for both Oil Painting and Acrylic painting are listed in this handout for this class. Most students will complete 2-3 paintings depending on the amount of detail that they wish to put into each work they create. I would plan on at least two surfaces to paint on. The smallest I would recommend is 8" x 10" However 11 x 14 or 12 x 16 gives you a bit more room to develop your images. I enjoy working on a square format and I will most likely use a 12' by 12 or 12 x 16 inch format. Ampersand gesso board is also a surface that I commonly use however you are welcome to use a painting surface that best suits your needs. If you enjoy painting small detail and smooth surface makes the painting a bit easier.

OIL PAINTING SUPPLIES LIST for Painting the Landscape in Oils-

The advantage of keeping your color palette simple is that you will spend more time painting and your colors will not get so muddy.

Mediums for OIL Painters

I mix four parts Gamsol with 1 part Stand Oil (Thickened Linseed Oil) in a jar ahead of time. It takes two to three days for this mixture to fully blend.

You can also use three parts Gamsol with one part linseed oil.

Another option for this class is to use walnut oil as it has less odor in a classroom setting. You just do not need much any medium to make the paint flow. Graham oil colors are made with Walnut oil whereas Windsor Newton paints are made with linseed oil. I store my medium in a small spice jar premixed, and then pour my painting medium and Gamsol into small metal cups with lids when I am painting.

OIL Painters: Please bring ODORLESS mineral spirits Gamsol in a small sealed metal container metal brush cleaner jar with a tight fitting snap lid. In general we want to keep the fumes down in the studio. I also recommend two metal palette cups which can be clipped to your palette so you have your painting medium in one cup and pure Gamsol in the other cup.

Oil Painters: Brushes: make sure the length of your brush handle is long.

- Flat Bristle Brushes - #10
- Bright Bristle Brush (short bristle) #4,#6,#8
 - Filberts - #3, #4, #6 hogs bristle
 - Round Bristle #2, #4

Palette cups) I like the two that are together that can slip under your palette – one for oil and one for mineral spirits /oil painting medium

Palette paper- I like the Gray Urban Artist Paper Palettes 12 x 16 as the sheets are disposable. You can also purchase this in white sheets. It is your preference.

Palette box if you want to keep your paints fresh and portable I like the Masterson Blue boxes with a snap lid. The disposable palette paper fits right in the box and makes clean up and transport much easier.

Latex or exam gloves to keep your hands clean

Q-tips for wiping out paint in small areas

Arches Oil Paper is great for small studies or a surface to mix your colors on-

- The photo references will be a horizontal format 8" by 10 "
- 2 jars/containers with lids for holding your medium (a small one like a baby food jar size will do just fine and a large-mouth lidded container for your Gamsol will suffice- Gamsol is odorless so we will not experience fumes

For both Oil and Acrylic Painters:

- Pencil (HB) and small notebook for taking notes or making preliminary sketches

Baby wipes

A small plastic bag to put your trash (paper towels and paper palettes and dirty gloves at the end of the day.

Apron or large painting shirt.

Paper Towels- I like Viva as they are less likely to shred

A small piece of white cotton cloth – with a smooth texture for wiping your canvas

Q Tips for cleaning up edges on the panel.

The Pullen Art Center is stocked with easels.

A small pad of canvas paper is very helpful for a small sketch and or testing your color mixing. I like the 10 x 12 size. Make sure you can paint with acrylic or oil. Raymar has Arches Oil paper which is also a wonderful surface.

For Acrylic Painters : I recommend Liquitex or Golden. If you want to use Lucas make sure you purchase Titanium White by Golden or Liquitex as it covers more readily.

Palette Paper for Acrylic – I use the Red Masterson Paint boxes which come with a sponge liner and disposable absorbent palette paper (purchased separately _that fits in the box size 12 x 16 inches. A small spray bottle with water is also handy to keep your paints moist.

 - 8) A small piece of white cotton cloth – with a smooth texture for wiping your canvas
 - 9) A pizza box or cardboard box to transport your painting in your car for oil paintings -(OIL Painters)
 - 10) A small notebook and pencil to make sketches – 9 x 12 or 8 x 10 is fine...or white sheets of loose paper is fine as well

Painting – Designing the Successful Landscape Painting in Oil or Acrylic – Part 2

Students will supply the painting materials for this class.

If students want to use the reference photos provided by the instructor there will be a \$5 dollar fee for each set of black and white and color 8 x 10 photograph of the subject matter for each image. The group will paint the first landscape study provided by the instructor as a class. After the first painting is completed the lab fee applies only to students who wish to use the reference photos provided by the instructor for the remaining painting projects.

Supplies for both Oil painting and Acrylic painting are listed in this handout for this class. Most students will complete 1-3 paintings depending on the amount of detail that they wish to put into each work they create. I would plan on at least two -three surfaces to paint on. The smallest I would recommend is 11 x 14 however 16 x 20 gives you a bit more room to develop your images. I enjoy working on a square format and I will most likely use a 12 x 16 inch format. Ampersand gesso board is also a surface that I commonly use however you are welcome to use a painting surface that best suits your needs. Dick Blick makes a hardboard that you can coat with a layer of gesso or acrylic paint to seal the surface. If you enjoy painting small detail a smooth surface makes the painting a bit easier.

Painting – Making Mixed Media Papers

Instructor: Joanna Moody. October 10-31 Tu 9:30am-12:00pm

This is an experimental class. Feel free to bring supplies you want to try out! Choose your favorite colors, paints and inks, papers, mark making tools, and stencils!

Paper:

18" x 24" 140 lb. Cold Press Watercolor paper.

Single sheets can be purchased at the Pullen supply store or you can buy a whole pad if you're prolific

Jerry's Artarama Example: Strathmore 140lb 18x24 pad

8.5x 11" OR 9"x12" paper- a pad or bundle of drawing paper or printer paper- you might go through this paper quickly

Glue stick (I like UHU stic)

Fluid matte medium and a paintbrush that you use for matte medium

Make up Wedge or other sponge applicator for stencilling

Acrylic Paint & Brushes (white, black, +3-5 colors you want to work with)

White Acrylic Ink- Example: Sennelier white acrylic ink

Water soluble mark making tools-In colors that you love. Use what you have or buy a few singles or a set to try out!
