Panels to Paint on: If you like a smooth surface you can order Masonite hard board from Dick Blick – You will need to paint the panel with a coat of acrylic paint. I usually paint the panel a medium- color that will be found in my painting. As a start I would mix black and white for a medium gray so that you can judge whether your color is lighter or darker from the middle of the value scale. Ampersand Gesso board is a professional archival panel but it is more costly. If you have canvas or canvas board you can bring them. For canvas I recommend canvas that has been stretched around the edge so it is easy to hang up as a finished project- The Edge company has this type of structure. You want white primed canvas so you can start to paint on the surface immediately, 3 panels 11 x 14 in size. The largest I would work initially would be or 11"-14 inches in size or 12 x 16 . I most likely will be using Centurion -Pre-primed panels for Acrylic size 11 x 14 -These panels can also be purchased at Jerry's Artarama in a package of three.

Assorted Supplies;

Since acrylic dries very quickly, I recommend a palette box with a cover on it size 12 x 16 .You can purchase a sponge and palette paper that fits down inside the box so you can lay your paint out on a disposable surface.(I use the Masterson Palette box with sponge and paper -12 x 16

Your medium to keep your paint wet is water.

You will need :

Paper Towels

Two small containers to hold water. Make sure these have a solid base so they do not tip over.

A blue pastel drawing pencil – (not oil base) Conte a Paris brand -Carolina blue color so that your lines will not show on your canvas or your may simply draw with a small round brush directly on the canvas or panel with acrylic paint.

A roll of painters tape to adhere your photographs.

A small tablet of Canvas paper 8 x 10 is fine for making swatches of color.

Pencil sharpener and pencil.



A small spray bottle (with water) to keep your paints moist. Palette paper if you do not use a palette box to mix your paints on. A roll of artist or masking tape. Apron for working.

Supply list:

Oil paint can be artist (professional grade) or student grade. You decide which to buy for this class. The difference besides price (student grade is cheaper), is that student grade has more fillers and has way less color pigment. Among different brands there will also be differences in how a paint behaves, but this is something you will get with experience and as you decide your preferences in how oil paint feels as you use it. Look at your materials like a long-term investment that will pay off.

Recommended oil paint colors: These colors will let you create any color you may need.

Titanium white Burnt Umber Prussian Blue Ultramarine blue Dioxazine purple Lamp Black Napthol red light Cadmium red deep Cadmium yellow medium Lemon yellow Viridian Carmine Gamsol and Old Holland Oil Painting Medium Quick Drying

Paint brushes that are made for oil painting:

Try these shapes first - Filberts and flats - before buying any other shapes. Long handled preferable over short so you get good habits. Hog bristle and synthetic blends specifically for oil.

Palette knife, at least one.
Paper Paint Palettes – You will need a hard surface to use as a base for paper palette. A piece of glass is ideal for your studio, but not for transport as it can break. Suggest a piece of plexiglass.
Palette paper – always makes it easy to fold up the used paint and throw away when fully dry.

Rags – old socks, old lint free cloth.

Paper Towels.

Several stretched canvas or hard surface painting substrate no smaller than 12x16, up to 24x30 size, enough for 6 classes, depends on how fast you paint.

Students need three tube colors- one blue, one red, one yellow. I recommend Ultramarine Blue, Winsor Yellow (Windsor Newton), and Scarlett Lake. You can use other colors too but at least ONE color has to be a dark value color.

Three 2oz. Polar Flo Squirt Bottles (sold in pack of three)

1 sheet of Arches Cold Press or Fabriano Artistico Cold Press Paper. 140 lb. Do NOT buy anything else.

Your normal watercolor palette. Brushes for touch-ups.

Paper towels. I use Viva w/ no texture.



One waterproof board approx 16x20". Can be plexiglass (cheap), Gator Board, or hard surface covered with freezer paper.

Squirt bottles large enough to wet entire 11x15" quickly.
