Paints for Oil Painters:

I recommend using Windsor Newton or Gamblin colors. Other options include Holbein or Rembrandt. Try to have a warm a cool version of your primary colors.

- Titanium White
- Lemon Yellow
- Cadmium Yellow Medium
- Yellow Ochre
- Cobalt Blue
- Ultramarine Blue
- Phthalocyanine Blue or Manganese Blue
- Cadmium Red Medium
- Quinacridone Crimson or Quinacridone Magenta
- Alizarin Crimson
- Burnt Sienna
- Viridian
- Ivory Black

Mediums for OIL Painters:

I mix four parts Gamsol with 1 part Stand Oil (Thickened Linseed Oil) in a jar ahead of time. It takes two to three days for this mixture to fully blend. You can also use three parts Gamsol with one part linseed oil.

Another option is to use walnut oil, as it has less odor in a classroom setting. Graham oil colors are made with Walnut oil whereas Windsor Newton paints are made with linseed oil. I store my premixed medium in a small spice jar, then pour my painting medium and Gamsol into small metal cups with lids when I am painting.

Please bring Gamsol ODORLESS mineral spirits in a small sealed metal container with a tight fitting snap lid. I also recommend two metal palette cups which can be clipped to your palette, so you have your painting medium in one cup and pure Gamsol in the other.

Brushes for Oil Painters:

Make sure the length of your brush handle is long.

- Flat Bristle Brushes (small, medium, large) #2, #4, #8
- Bright Bristle Brush (short bristle) #4, #6, #8
- Filberts (hog bristle) #3, #4, #6
- Round Bristle #2, #4 , 6

For Oil Paint Storage and Mixing:



- Palette Knife #11 is helpful for scraping up paint and moving large masses around.
- Palette cups I like the two that are together that can slip under your palette one for oil and one for mineral spirits/oil painting medium.
- Palette paper I like the Gray Urban Artist Paper Palettes, size 12 x 16, as the sheets are disposable. You can also purchase this in white sheets—your choice.
- Palette box If you want to keep your paints fresh and portable I like the Masterson Blue boxes with a snap lid. The disposable palette paper fits right in the box and makes clean up and transport much easier.
- Latex or exam gloves To keep your hands clean.
- Q-tips For wiping out paint in small areas.
- Arches Oil Paper Great for small studies or a surface to mix your colors on for oil painters.
- Canvas primed paper Either for oil or acrylic.
- 1 roll of 1/8 inch white artist tape
- 2 jars/containers with lids For holding your medium. A small one like a baby food jar size will do just fine and a large-mouth lidded container for your Gamsol (Gamsol is oderless so we will not experience fumes).

ACRYLIC PAINTERS

Paints for Acrylic Painters:

I recommend Liquitex or Golden. If you want to use Lucas make sure you purchase Titanium White by Golden or Liquitex, as it is covers more readily.

Medium for Acrylic Painters:

You can use water, so bring two clean plastic cups and a small spray bottle to keep your paints wet.

Brushes for Acrylic Painters:

I like the Silver Bristlon or Silverwhite. For Acrylic I also like the Ebony Splendor – flats and rounds available at Jerry's Artarama. Make sure the length of your brush handle is long.

- Flat Bristle #2, #4, #6
- Bright Bristle Brush (short bristle) #4, #6, #8
- Filberts (hog bristle) #3, #4, #6
- Round Bristle #2, #4, #8



For Acrylic Paint Storage and Mixing:

- Container with snap on lid I like the red lidded Masterson Boxes that come with changeable sponges and mixing paper that fit in the boxes. This way your paint will not dry out.
- A #11 palette knife Also helpful for mixing paint.
- Palette paper I use the Red Masterson Paint boxes which come with a sponge liner and disposable absorbent palette paper (purchased separately, that fits in the box size 12 x 16 inches).
- A small spray bottle with water Also handy to keep your paints moist.

Oil AND Acrylic Painters:

- Pencil (HB) and small notebook For taking notes or making preliminary sketches.
- Baby wipes
- Latex gloves
- A medium blue Conte A Paris PASTEL pencil For drawing on your canvas paper
- A small plastic bag For trash at the end of the day.
- Apron or large painting shirt
- Paper Towels I like Viva as they are less likely to shred.
- A small piece of white cotton cloth with a smooth texture For wiping your canvas.
- Q-tips For cleaning up edges etc. on the panel.
- A small pad of canvas paper is very helpful for a small sketch and or testing your color mixing. I like the 10 x 12 size. Make sure you can paint with acrylic or oil. Raymar has Arches Oil paper which is also a wonderful surface.

- 1. Acrylic Paint Colors:
 - a. Mars Black
 - b. Titanium White
 - c. Cadmium Red (Cadmium Hue is ok)
 - d. Cadmium Yellow (Cadmium Hue is ok, medium or light)
 - e. Cadmium Orange (Cadmium Hue is ok)
 - f. Cyan or Primary Blue
 - g. Green Permanent (if this is not available, any green that makes you think 'Ireland')
 - h. Dioxazine Purple
- 2. Matte Medium, low viscosity
- 3. Brushes
 - a. Flats: recommended in any size between 8-12
 - b. Filberts: recommended in any size between 4-10
 - c. Rounds: recommended in any size between 0-8
 - d. One of each at least
- 4. Palette Knives: a pack or assortment is recommended. Having one or two is necessary.
- 5. Disposable palette, gray surface if possible
- 6. 3 plastic quart containers
- 7. Rags/paper towles
- 8. 18x24 canvas pad with at least 12 sheets. If you wish to work on canvas this is ok. Make sure you have at least 12.
- 9. Students may bring any other paints or materials they wish to work with.
