Current students should bring projects they are working on.

New students are required to purchase the full kit of tools and supplies from the instructor. *Instructor needs one month's notice to order supplies for new students*. New students are highly encouraged to contact the instructor for more information before enrolling. Additional supplies will be available for purchase from instructor during class.

There are 2 kit options for new students:

- 1. 2 small seasonal designs on silk habutae fabric, design is printed in color and stitching is added to some areas. Embroidery frame, needles and tools will be provided for use during class time only. Student will take the embroidery home when completed. Kit fee is \$80, cash or check, payable at the first class. A good option to try it out.
- 2. The first official curriculum design, for students who plan to continue studying. All the design is stitched. Student will buy the full kit of frame, tools, fabric and fiber, total cost is \$302.75. Multiple classes are required to complete the design.

 - 4. Small Soho spray bottle
 - 5. Board to put paper on can be plexiglass, wood, or gator board. Needs to be waterproof.

- Speedball FABRIC Screen Print Ink black and a couple of other colors or whatever colors you want to print with. Another good brand is Jaquard. (For dark fabrics you want OPAQUE ink)
- Two 11x14' Screen Printing Frames only available at Jerry's Artarama. You can do larger or smaller frames depending on your budget.
- We will also learn how to stretch our own screens (two 14' stretcher bars and two 18' stratcher bars and some un-stratched silk screen fabric)
 - Note: silk screen fabric is only available at the Sertoma Arts Center store. I will cover making your own screen in class
- Whatever you want to print on: t-shirts, sweatshirts, aprons, bags, etc. Make sure they are 100% cotton
 or 50/50 cotton/acrylic blend for best results
 - o Buy t-shirts cheap at www.cheapstees.com or www.dharmatrading.com
- Bring an idea for your first projects
 - You want a high contrast image where the lines aren't too thin
- Optional:
 - Your own squeegee for printing at home
 - Paper for printing Arches cover or Stonehenge work well
