Step 1





Draw a design on your lantern. You can use crayons, markers, pens, or even paint. Fold your paper in

half, length-wise (like a hot dog). Cut slits up from the fold. Leave space at the top. Step 3



Unfold the paper. Hold the shorter sides and roll into a cylinder. Glue, tape, or staple the sides toStep 4



Glue, tape, or staple the handle to the top.


You'll Need:

Step 2



Your paper should look like this when you have finished.



Step 3

Unfold the paper and make a design with markers, crayons, or colored pencils.



Fold your paper back into an accordion. Fold in half, and glue two of the sides together.





After the glue dries, spread out the pleats, and you're all done!
