## Historic Resources and Museums Program



Do you have a potential donation that lends to the immediate needs of the HRM Program? See below for our “wish list” broken down by our sites.

### **Mordecai Historic Park**

- Anything connected to Andrew Johnson’s youth, the early 19th century in Raleigh.
- Items with connection to George E. Badger and/or James Iredell when they practiced law in Raleigh or after they retired.
- Papers, objects, oral histories, photographs that can be traced to the African American population that lived on the Mordecai property.
- Priest/minister items that date to the 19th century including items to be used in a chapel.

### **Fred Fletcher Park**

- Photographs and objects illustrating the early years of the Methodist Home for Children.
- Material culture connecting people with the property.

### **John Chavis Memorial Park**

- Any objects, photographs, or papers connected to the early days of the park.

### **City of Raleigh Museum**

- Objects, images, or archives that date before

1870. Most significantly, the late colonial era, 1750s-1790s.

### **Dorothea Dix Park**

- Medical equipment used at the Hospital
- Images during the years the property was a Hospital

### **Latta University Historic Park**

- Any objects, images, and papers connected to when Latta University existed and the Oberlin Village Neighborhood

### **Moore Square**

- Objects, images, and papers directly connected to the Square and/or the surrounding neighborhood including Hargett Street, Wilmington Street, and City Market.

### **Parks, Recreation and Cultural Resources**

- Photographs that show what City of Raleigh parks looked like over the years.

### **Pope House Museum**

- Papers that illustrate Dr. Pope’s many business connections in Raleigh and when he ran for Mayor in 1919.
- Medical tools and instruments indicative of a early 20th century private practice.
