Largemouth Bass Fishing by Season

Anglers! Learn techniques for catching Largemouth Bass with the N.C. Fishing Trail at Lake Wheeler. Largemouth Bass use different habitats throughout the year, and to be successful at catching fish, anglers should understand the seasonal patterns of largemouth bass. The trail consists of 11 sites: 3 for summer and winter fishing and 4 for pre- and post-spawn fishing and 4 for year-round fishing.

Fish Attractors

Different fish attractors are designed to congregate fish based on location and depth.

Jacks and spider blocks mimic stumps and logs while quad trees mimic real trees.
