

Proposed Considerations

Safety, Security, Visual Aesthetics

- Delineate between public and private property with the use of fencing, landscaping
- Controlled access
- Implement clear sight lines
- Signage (Enforcement)

Maintenance & Operation, Community Expense

Greenway Acquisition, Property Impacts

- Easement Acquisition fair market value
- Improve drainage







Next Steps

- Advance Design for Alignment Option 2 to 60%.
- Work with the adjacent community and address fencing placement, design, landscape features, signage, and easement acquisition.
