#### Creation of Pullen Park

- On March 22<sup>nd</sup>, 1887, Mr.
  Richard Stanhope Pullen
  acquired this land from Eason
  Lee farm with the intention of
  dividing the land between the
  City of Raleigh for a public
  park and the State of North
  Carolina for the campus of
  "College of Agricultural and
  Mechanical Arts" later known
  as N.C State University.
- The park land was officially named "Pullen Park" as of April 1st, 1887, making it the first public park in NC and the South, one of the oldest amusement parks in the country, and the 14th oldest park in the world.



#### The Zoo

- In 1889, Mr. Howell began the first steps in creating a zoo in the park. The first purchases of animals were racoons, rabbits, guinea pigs, and a monkey. He faced many challenges in keeping the zoo animals healthy and safe.
- In 1928, Belle the lioness was presented by the John Robinson Circus. Like many of the exotic animals in the zoo, she only lived a few years in the park before passing away as well. Both Belle and Jim did bring in a massive number of crowds to the park; about 2000 every Sunday.



Andy and Opi Statue

• The statue was dedicated to Pullen Park on October 28th, 2003 from TV Land. As seen on the plaque: it depicts a quote from the famous Andy Griffith show "a simpler time a sweeter place" which is very fitting for a place like Pullen Park and goes back to Mr. Pullen's vision of what he wanted the park to be for guests who came to enjoy it.
