




Design your own skyscraper to add to the Raleigh skyline!

The Briggs Building was built in 1874 by Thomas Briggs, Sr. and for nearly 30 years was the tallest building in Raleigh. The building was mostly known for the Briggs Hardware store on the first floor and in the basement, but it housed other businesses throughout its history like a theater, social club, tailor, and even a museum. Later on, steel and concrete began to be used in construction which made it possible to build the taller buildings you see downtown today.




