Specialty elastics and findings are required for bra-making, and are best purchased online for selection and cost. This post is a great resource for how to find bra making supplies online: https://clothhabit.com/bramaking-resources/

- 1.5 yards stable stretch fabric such as cotton spandex jersey or tricot
- .25 yard cotton knit fabric for underwear lining
- 2 Yards shoulder strap elastic
- Hook-and-eye bra closure with at least two rows of hooks
- 6 Yards fold-over elastic or picot elastic
- 1.25 wide band elastic (optional)
- 2 yards stretch lace (optional)
- 1 pair of rings and sliders for bra staps
- Ballpoint Stretch Size 12 or 14 Needle
- Sewing Scissors (never used on paper)
- Pins
- Pin holder
- Chalk, Frixion Pen, or other marking utensil
- Clear Ruler
- Measuring Tape
- Spool of Thread

Fibers - Embroidered Wonderlands

- 6" inch embroidery hoop
- Assorted colors of embroidery floss (all kinds work)
- Pearl cotton any sizes
- Embroidery needles (best are called embroidery ribbon needles)
- Large eye needle for yarn with sharp point
- 12"x12" cotton or linen (denim weight fabric)
- Scraps of fabric any types , some easy to fray and some stretchy.
- Beads, any colors or sizes (make sure you have needles that fit)
- Wool or synthetic yarn
- Bit of stuffing (handful)
- A small bag of roving wool (1 or 2 colors)
- Fabric Scissors
- A fabric pen or sharpie

- 5 6 reactive dye colors (any)
- Soda ash
- Urea
- As many small containers for dye mixes as dyes employed
- Long spoons for mixing dye
- Rubber bands
- 2 cotton yarn bobbins
- Plastic sheets for covering floor and tables
- Plastic bags for students to carry their dyed fabrics
- Pipe cleaners in different colors for identifying the samples
- Needles in different sizes appropriate for the yarn.
- Fabric scissors
- 2 yards white 100% cotton pre-washed fabric
- Plastic gloves



Fibers - Traditional Japanese Embroidery

Current students should bring projects they are working on.

New students are required to purchase the full kit of tools and supplies from the instructor. *Instructor needs one month's notice to order supplies for new students*. The supplies and tools for this class all originate in Japan via the Japanese Embroidery Center. The instructor will order and supply the students with the appropriate materials. New students are highly encouraged to contact the instructor for more information before enrolling. Additional supplies will be available for purchase from instructor during class.

There are 2 kit options for new students:

- 1. 2 small seasonal designs on silk habutae fabric, design is printed in color and stitching is added to some areas. Embroidery frame, needles and tools will be provided for use during class time only. Student will take the embroidery home when completed. **Kit fee is \$80**, cash or check, payable at the first class. A good option to try it out.
- 2. The first official curriculum design, for students who plan to continue studying. All the design is stitched. Student will buy the full kit of frame, tools, fabric and fiber, **total cost is \$302.75**. Multiple classes are required to complete the design.

Painting – Abstract Watercolor Compositions

• Watercolor Paint Tubes:

Required: Ultramarine Blue, Yellow Ochre, crimson red, violet, viridian green, black and white

Suggested colors: rose madder, magenta, burnt sienna, lemon yellow, cerulean blue, turquoise, sap green, burnt amber and whatever others you want to add.

- 9" x 12" watercolor pad
- One bottle of Pebeo, Winsor and Newton, or Graffix masking fluid
- Small spray bottle
- Board to put paper on needs to be waterproof
- Watercolor palette
- Brushes for watercolor Flats and rounds. Ideally a good range between 20 6 in size.
- 2" masking tape
- Suggested paper for nicer pieces: 1 or 2 sheets of professional watercolor paper.



Painting - Beginning Watercolors with Ryan Fox

Thanks for registering for the class. This is a bare-bones supply list. I will show you the brushes and paints I use in the class and you are welcome to purchase additional supplies as we continue. However, I do not want you to spend a lot of money on supplies you might not need or want. Please call or email if you have any questions and I look forward to seeing you.

Supplies to bring:

- MOST IMPORTANT: Good watercolor paper. You can have the best brushes and paints in the world and you will not be able to paint anything (worth a darn) with cheap paper.
 - Buy several 22x30 sheets of professional watercolor paper. I use Arches or Fabriano Artistico 140lb Cold press or rough surface.
 - We will work on 1/4" sheet sizes (11x15").
 - *Do not cut paper before class.
 - Watercolor blocks are as good as individual sheets.

Watercolor pads are NOT good paper.

- At least one each of the three primary colors, all colors are Winsor & Newton unless specified:
 - o Red-Rose Madder Hue (Turner), or Scarlett Lake
 - Yellow- Aureolin, or Winsor Yellow
 - Blue- Ultramarine Blue and Cobalt Blue (buy both), Cerulean Blue (recommended but pricey)
- Optional:
 - o Burnt Sienna
 - Yellow Ochre
 - Perinone Orange (Daniel Smith)
 - Imperial Purple (Daniel Smith)
 - Shadow Violet (Daniel Smith)
 - Lunar Black (Daniel Smith)
- Watercolor brushes- Squirrel mop brush- #2 or #4, Round #4 or #6 brush for finer details. Squirrel mop brushes
 can be very expensive- you can get decent cheap ones online. Highly recommended for big washes- you are
 welcome to try a few of mine out before buying.
- Paper towels. I use Viva w/ no pattern.
- One small bottle of masking fluid. Make sure liquid isn't clumpy or solidified- please open before purchasing. I
 use Pebeo and Graffix though Daniel Smith and Winsor Newton Masking fluid will work too. Do NOT buy Winsor
 Newton Permanent Masking fluid
- Cheap medium sized brush for masking fluid. Nothing fancy.
- Water container
- Watercolor Palette- I like the Sterling Edwards Big Brush palette but I also own several Richeson Covered
 Palettes. Make sure your palette is big enough to mix lots of paint with water so you have big puddles of color
 ready to go.
- Drawing supplies. Pencils, white erasers, pencil sharpeners

- Water resistant board to put paper on. This could be gatorboard, plexiglass, or wood. You could even cover cardboard with freezer paper and put watercolor on top.
- Page 6 of 11
- 2" masking tape or painters tape. I prefer yellow masking tape
- Sense of humor (required)

- 1. Acrylic Paint Colors:
 - Mars Black
 - Titanium White
 - Cadmium Red (Cadmium Hue is ok)
 - Cadmium Yellow (Cadmium Hue is ok, medium or light)
 - Cadmuim Orange (Cadmium Hue is ok)
 - Ultramarine Blue
 - Green Permanent (if this is not available, any green that makes you think 'Ireland')
 - Dioxazine Purple
 - Any other colors you wish to use
- 2. Matte Medium
- 3. Brushes:
 - Flats: recommended in any size between 8-12
 - Fillberts: recommended in any size between 4-10
 - Rounds: recommended in any size 0-8
 - One of each at least
- 4. Palette Knives: a pack or assortment is recommended. Having one or two is necessary.
- 5. Disposable palette, gray surface if possible
- 6. 3 plastic quart containers
- 7. Rags/paper towles
