# **Summer Camp Field Trips**



## **Background**

Here at the City of Raleigh (COR) Museum and Pope House Museum, we strive to make history come alive! Our goal is to provide a variety of hands-on programs that will engage students and get them excited about their local history. Our programs use local historic sites, artifacts, and photographs. Many of our programs correspond to exhibits currently on display at the museum. Some programs will have recommended grade levels, and some can be adapted to multiple grade levels.

#### Frequently Asked Questions

- Q. How much do field trips cost? A. Our field trips are \$2 per participant
- Q. How many participants and groups can we bring? A. We can accommodate up to 75 participants. We request that you schedule more days if you have more than 75 participants.
- Q. What does a typical field trip schedule look like?
  A. The trip will consist of three rotations with indoor and outdoor programs available. Students will be split into their classes for the duration of the trip (with the exception of Capitol Games).
- Q. When are field trips offered? A. Tuesday-Friday, 10 a.m.-4 p.m.
- Q. Can we have lunch at the museum after the field trip?
  A. Unfortunately, we cannot provide a space for lunch; however, we are a five-minute walk from three parks (Nash Square, Moore Square, and Capitol Square), which provide a great lunch space.
- Q. Do you have field trips for middle or high school students? A. For middle and high school groups, please contact the museum for offerings specific to your curriculum needs.
- Q. Is there a gift shop?

A. Yes! We have a gift shop. However, due to the size, we ask that 10 participants shop at a time. If you are interested in shopping, please let us know in advance so we can be ready for your group! Also, we can provide a grab bag for \$5 per participant with fun gifts for each child. Make sure to note this on the inquiry form.
