Brushes: Jerry's Artarama makes a brand called Ebony Splendor by Creative Mark. They come in a pack of assorted flats, or assorted rounds as well as a mixed flat/round pack. If you do not have brushes, these work well.

Paper: 1 sheet of Arches 140 cold press 22×30 inch sheet (this can be purchased through Pullen's onsite supply store). We will cut this into smaller sections. Fabriano paper may also be used. Paper sold in a block format is also fine. 8×10 or $9 \times 12 - 140$ ib paper is fine-cold press.

Students need three tube colors- one blue, one red, one yellow. I recommend Ultramarine Blue, Winsor Yellow (Windsor Newton), and Scarlett Lake. You can use other colors too but at least ONE color has to be a dark value color.

Three 2oz. Polar Flo Squirt Bottles (sold in pack of three)

1 sheet of Arches Cold Press or Fabriano Artistico Cold Press Paper. 140 lb. Do NOT buy anything else.

Your normal watercolor palette. Brushes for touch-ups.

Paper towels. I use Viva w/ no texture.

One waterproof board approx 16x20". Can be plexiglass (cheap), Gator Board, or hard surface covered with freezer paper.

Squirt bottles large enough to wet entire 11x15" quickly.

Container for water

Sense of humor (required)
