

TARBORO ROAD PARK PROJECT

The 2022 City of Raleigh Parks Bond allocates **\$29.5 million** in funding for redevelopment of Tarboro Road Park including a new community center, new outdoor amenities and recreational features, and improvements to the St. Monica Teen Center.

Community Center: The new two-story, 20,000 square foot community center anchors the eastern portion of the site, maintaining visibility and easy access to central park amenities. A new parking area and sports court on the western side provide a buffer from the neighboring residential area. At the heart of the site, the playground offers City staff supervision in a safe, engaging environment.

"Past to Present Promenade": A landscaped plaza connecting the new center and the historic St. Monica Teen Center creates a shared gathering space with safe pedestrian access between the facilities. This connection celebrates opportunities for public art while honoring the neighborhood's rich history.

Connectivity: Direct pedestrian pathways from Tarboro Street and the new Bus Rapid Transit stop on Edenton Street lead to the community center entrance. Covered porch areas along the center's frontage provide sheltered outdoor gathering spaces that integrate the building with surrounding park amenities.

St. Monica Teen Center Renovation: The historic St. Monica Teen Center will receive interior focused on modernization, enhanced functionality, and long-term efficiency, along with necessary roofing repairs.




Construction Document Phase Completion	End of 2026
