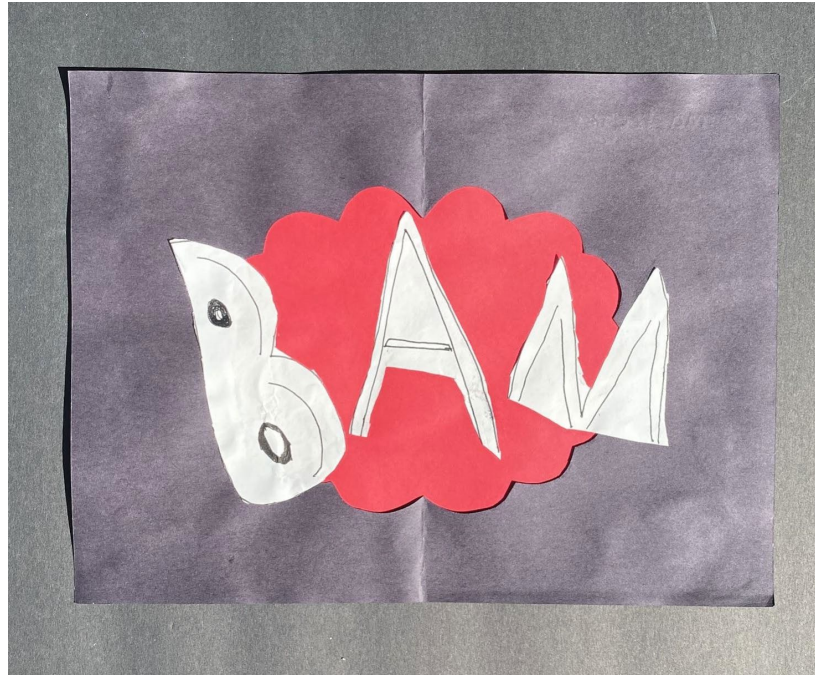
The teens have demonstrated their mastery of Pop Art with inspiration from comics and their favorite onomatopoeia words.

George Seurat is a neo-impressionist artist known for developing the Pointillist method. **Pointillism** is an art technique that uses small distinct dots to form an image. The technique does not require mixing colors, therefore, pointillism focuses on the optical illusion of the color theory

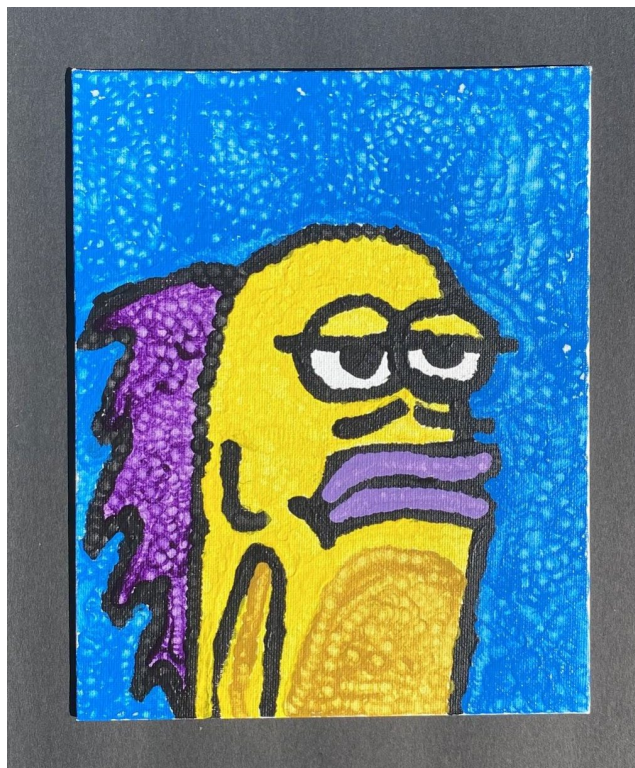
The teens have demonstrated their mastery of pointillism with the use of Q-tips, Paint, and markers.
