Mineral Detectives: (Ages 8-13)

Don't be fooled by fool's gold - learn how geologists test minerals by using properties including hardness, streak, color, luster, and acid reactivity. Take on the challenge of testing and identifying a variety of mineral samples. Take home a mineral for your own collection! **Cost:** \$4
