International Compost Awareness Week

Twenty-five percent of the waste America throws in landfills is organic materials like food scraps and yard waste that could instead be composted. Composting hastens nature's recycling process and creates nutrientrich soil gardeners refer to as "black gold". When organic materials end up in landfills they cannot properly decompose and emit methane (CH4), a greenhouse gas 30x more potent at trapping heat in our atmosphere than carbon dioxide (CO2). Instead of throwing your food waste in the garbage, create a compost pile by mixing carbon rich materials like leaves, sticks, and paper napkins with your nitrogen-rich food scraps like fruits, vegetables, and grains.

May 4–10 is International Compost Awareness Week! Celebrate by starting your own home compost pile to make nutrient–rich soil for your garden. If you cannot start your own pile at home, you can drop food scraps off for free at Wake County Convenience Centers #2, #4, and #7 where they are picked up by Compost Now. Composting allows you to reduce your garbage, save money on soil, and helps the planet!

May is National Bike Month



Mobile Carwashes in Your Neighborhood

Are you getting your car washed in your neighborhood? Use these helpful tips to make sure soapy water doesn't end up in storm drains and in our streams.

- Wash vehicles on grass or gravel areas.
- Block storm drains with a berm or mats if washing on the street.
- Don't clean any engines or vehicle parts.
- Never put soap or other chemicals down the storm drain!

If you have a mobile carwash near your home, please let us know. We can make sure soapy water and other pollution doesn't get into the stormwater system.

Purchasing Flood Insurance

Homeowners and business insurance policies do not cover losses from floods or flood damage. Flood insurance policies must be purchased separately to protect valuable assets, such as a home, business, and possessions. There is a 30-day waiting period for a policy to become effective.

FLOOD ZONE	LEVEL OF FLOOD RISK	INSURANCE
X	Moderate to Low	Highly Recommended
AE	Moderate to High	Required

- Properties in Flood Zone X are highly recommended to carry flood insurance. Residents who are insured in Zone X file approximately 40 percent (%) of flood insurance claims.
- Properties in Flood Zone AE must carry flood insurance if they have a federally backed mortgage.
- **Renters** are encouraged to purchase flood policies to protect personal property with contents coverage.

When flood insurance is purchased, keep a record of the policy and an itemized list of furnishings, clothing, and valuables in a safe place, such as a safe deposit box. Take photos and document receipts of your items. Call your agent or broker immediately if you suffer flood damage.


