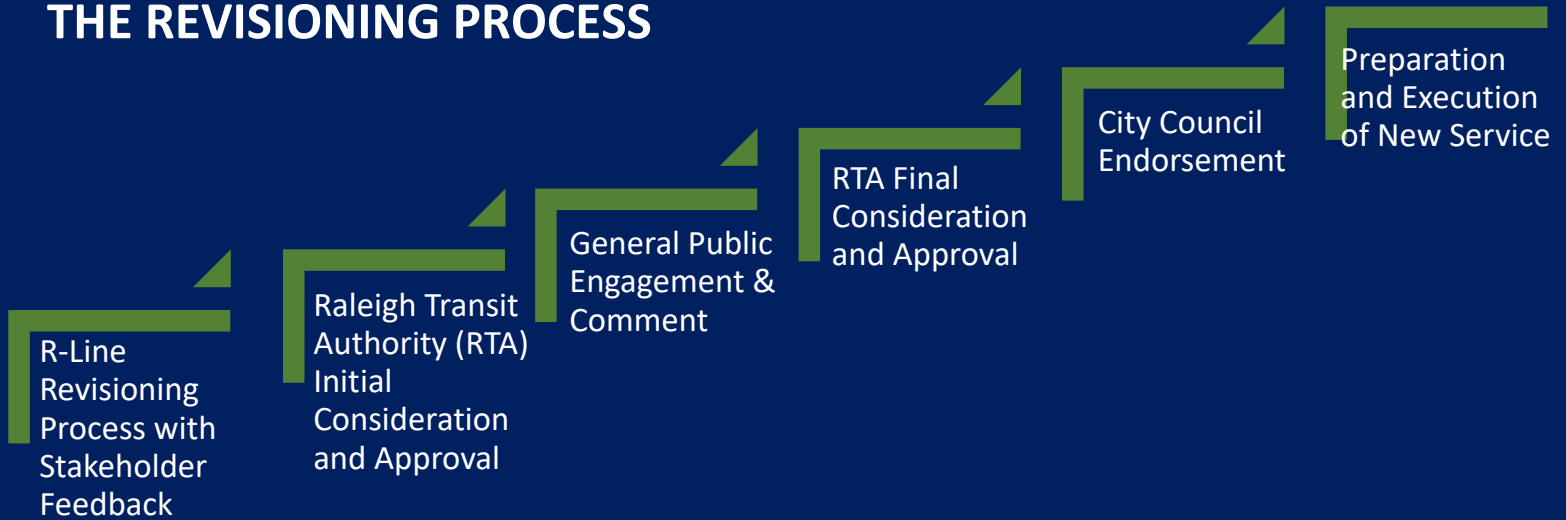

WHY THE 'REVISIONING' PROCESS?

- ❖ Declining performance of the R-Line Route
- ❖ Growing downtown population
- ❖ More downtown destinations and attractions to serve
- ❖ Competing demand-response, transportation alternatives (i.e. Uber, scooters, etc.)

THE HISTORY OF THE R-LINE

- ❖ **Lunch Time Trolley Circulator since 1983**
 - For weekday lunch service
- ❖ **Showtime Trolley Circulator since 1999**
 - 3 evenings per week
- ❖ **R-Line Circulator since 2008**
 - 7 days per week, 18+ hours average per day

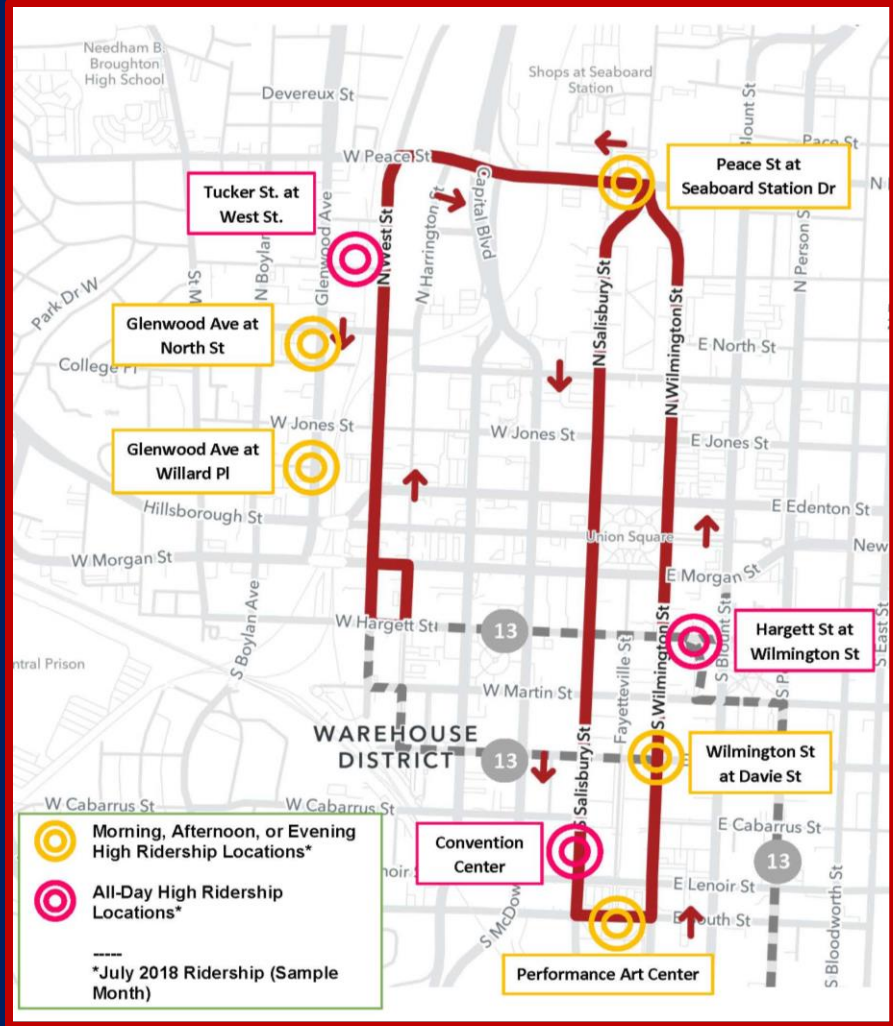
Since 2018, the Raleigh Transit Authority (RTA) and the city's Department of Transportation-Transit Staff have engaged with a revisioning process to assess the R-Line route. This process included an 8-month assessment with a public stakeholder group, to include representatives from various organizations and agencies inside and outside of the downtown area.

Recommendations from the stakeholder's assessment were later brought to the RTA to further evaluate, yielding a final recommendation, a new bi-directional route. At the October 2019 RTA Meeting, the board approved the proposed route and approved for staff to initiate the public comment period.
