Raleigh Parking Changes Coming Soon!

City Owned Parking Decks

The City of Raleigh owns nine parking decks, offering approximately 8,500 public parking spaces. Changes aim to encourage short-term parkers to use parking decks, making more parking spaces available to our customers and providing a better, lowcost option for evening workers in Downtown.

Timing

Parking Deck rate changes take effect Oct. 1, 2019

New rates

- \$1.50/hour, first 4 hours
- \$2.00/hour after 4 hours to daily maximum
- Daily Maximum \$14.00

New Special Event Rate

- \$10.00 flat rate
- This rate is charged regularly at the Performing Arts Deck and Convention Center Underground Deck for performances and events
- This rate is also charged throughout all Cityowned parking decks a few times a year for large-scale events that bring more than 10,000 visitors to downtown.

New Lost Ticket Rate

\$25.00

Parking Deck Enhancements

- Reserved parking spaces in parking decks have been removed in all publicly accessible areas to increase available spaces
- City of Raleigh vehicles have been relocated to the top of the parking decks to create more available open parking spaces
- The Downtown evening employee monthly parking rate will continue to be \$20.00/month, but access to the parking decks will start at 3 p.m. and end at 6 a.m. to better accommodate the needs of the Downtown evening workers. - Several parking deck enhancement projects are underway to provide better lighting, signage, cleanliness, and more security surveillance at City owned parking decks.
- The City is actively pursuing other opportunities to increase the available parking supply in Downtown as well as provide lower cost alternatives to our current parking program.

In order to encourage more access to parking and better turnover of parking spaces, Raleigh Parking has made several changes to parking rates, hours, and utilization of parking decks. Revenue from these parking changes will be reinvested in parking infrastructure, parking supply creation, safety enhancements, and modernization of parking technology.

On-Street Metered Parking

Changes to on-street metered parking hours and rates aim to provide better usage and turnover of our on-street parking spaces for those who live, work, or visit our city.

Timing

New on-street parking meters including new rates and metered hours are expected to be installed between late October 2019 and January 2020. The Hillsborough Street Corridor will get the first wave of new on-street parking meters, followed by the Glenwood South Corridor and the Downtown Central Business District.

New on-street metered parking hours

- Hillsborough Street Corridor: 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. M-F
- Glenwood South Corridor and Downtown Central Business District:
 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. M-F

New on-street metered parking rates beginning October 2019

- Hillsborough Street Corridor and Fayetteville Street: \$1.50/hour
- All other streets: \$1.25/hour

New on-street parking meter enhancements

- Better accessibility: large backlit color screen and multi-lingual interface
- Know your plate: enter your license plate & zone number to pay
- Use a card, coins, or the Passport parking mobile app

Questions? Parking Ambassadors will be deployed along with new on-street parking meters to help walk customers through the new process and answer any questions.
