
The Western Corridor is about twelve miles with new dedicated lanes between downtown Raleigh and downtown Cary.




What Will BRT Lanes Look Like?


A key part of the preliminary design phase is developing options for the BRT lanes. Below are examples of what these lanes may look like.

Business Access and Transit Lane: a dedicated lane for transit that also allows other vehicles to access driveways.



Dedicated Lanes for BRT: a median or center lane separated from general traffic.





Mixed Traffic: BRT buses will operate in the general traffic lanes with other vehicles.
